Cleveland Walking Tour | Thursday: 11:00-2:00 | Cost \$0

Volunteers will lead a Walking Tour around downtown Cleveland to give visitors an overview of the City. The tour will include maps provided by Destination Cleveland with historic pop outs and information. Also included in the tour will be a trip to the top of Tower City for a view of downtown Cleveland and lunch at a downtown location.



University Circle Museums Tour | Friday: Departs 10:00 & 11:00 Returns 12:30, 2:30, 3:30 | Cost \$40

Cleveland's **University Circle** features the Cleveland Museum of Art, Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA), the Cleveland History Center, the Cleveland Botanical Gardens, and the Cleveland Natural History Museum.

The **Cleveland Museum of Art** is one of the most critically acclaimed art museums in the world. It was founded in 1913 "for the benefit of all the people forever". They strive to help the broadest possible audience understand and engage with the world's great art while honoring the highest aesthetic, intellectual, and professional standards. The art museum is proud to be one of the world's most distinguished comprehensive art museums and one of northeastern Ohio's principal civic and cultural institutions.



Cleveland's **Museum of Contemporary Art (MOCA)** plays an urgent and exciting role in the city's cultural landscape. As a non-collecting institution and the region's only contemporary art museum, MOCA is ever-changing, introducing new exhibitions three times a year and creating fresh experiences for visitors each season. Since its founding in 1968, MOCA has presented the works of more than 2,000 artists to our region, often through artists' first solo shows.



The **Cleveland History Center** features a collection of various documents and artifacts that weaves a narrative about Northeast Ohio's history. These collections are part of rotating temporary and permanent exhibits such as the Euclid Beach Park Grand Carousel.



The **Cleveland Botanical Gardens** is comprised of 10 acres of outdoor gardens and an 18,000-square-foot Glasshouse. Guests exploring the Glasshouse will find over 350 species of exotic plants and 50 different types of butterflies, birds, amphibians and reptiles native to Costa Rica and Madagascar. The canopy walk, daily butterfly releases, and chameleon feedings are just some of the highlights.



Guests visiting the **Cleveland Museum of Natural History** can interact in their dinosaur hall, escape to the outdoor galleries and learn about Ohio's rich biodiversity, or participate in an enriching learning experience in the Smead Discovery Center.



Lolly the Trolley City Tour | Friday: 10:00-12:20 | Cost \$25

Lolly the Trolley offers sightseeing tours of Cleveland that includes iconic sights such as the West Side Market, Playhouse Square and the world's largest outdoor chandelier, and the recently renovated Public Square.



Pro Football Hall of Fame Tour | Saturday: 9:00-3:00 | Cost \$25

The recently renovated **Pro Football Hall of Fame** pays tribute to the talents and triumphs of pro football's greatest stars. Guests can visit the Hall of Fame Gallery that houses the bronze bust of each Hall of Famer, learn about the history of football in the NFL's First Century Gallery, and view game footage of previous Super Bowls in the Lamar Hunt Super Bowl Gallery.



West Side Market & Brewery Tours | Saturday: 10:45-2:30 | Cost \$15

Since opening to shoppers on November 2, 1912, the **West Side Market**, Cleveland's oldest continuously operating municipally owned market, has anchored the historic Ohio City neighborhood. The grand 241' x 124' structure has 44-foot high Guastavino tile vaulted ceiling and a clock tower, which stands 137' tall. The tower was historically fashioned with a clock designed and manufactured by the Seth Thomas Clock Company. In 2008, the West Side Market was designated as one of "10 Great Public Places in America," by the American Planning Association and continues to offer an authentic and culturally diverse shopping experience. The West Side Market celebrated its Centennial in 2012.

Great Lakes Brewing Company was the first brewpub and microbrewery in the state. In 2015, it was the 21st-largest craft brewery by volume and the 28th-largest overall brewery in the United States. The GLBC brewery tour commences in the new Beer Symposium where guests can grab their first brew and view displays that showcase GLBC's heritage and unique company culture. The tour ends across the street in the production brewery for more beer samples and a fun, in-depth exploration of the brewing process.

The **Market Garden Brewery** recently opened a new production facility where visitors can learn how their beer gets made, see their brewers in action and hear their story. Market Garden features a deep lineup of award-winning beers like their Progress Pilsner, organically hopped Citramax IPA, and their most popular beer, Prosperity Wheat.



Rocky River Nature Center Tour | Saturday: 9:30-12:00 | Cost \$15

Nestled in the Rocky River Valley, **Rocky River Nature Center** offers spectacular views of a 360 million year old shale cliff from the deck overhanging the river. The Nature Center provides a full visitor experience with opportunities to discover and learn about current Ohio wildlife, ancient species such as Dunkleosteus, as well as prehistoric and pioneer cultures. HideAway Hollow is a giant oak tree where kids can play and discover. Guests can explore the gardens outside on their way to over 5 miles of trails that lead from the Nature Center.
